

TRUST-BUILDING FOR Sustainable Peace and Reconciliation has to start in Schools.




WHOWEARE

Nansen Dialogue Centre (NDC) Mostar is an independent non-governmental organisation that encourages democratic practices and promotes dialogue among different ethnic groups as a tool for prevention and resolution of conflict in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Founded after the war by citizens striving to rebuild the social fabric of their city, NDC Mostar began in 1995 through an educational programme of the Nansen Academy in Lillehammer, Norway. We are registered as an independent local organisation since 2001 and remain a member of the regional Nansen Dialogue Network.

We work in a particularly complex political environment, highly influenced by prejudiced media rhetoric. Our work is mainly focused on the Herzegovina region of the country, and especially those communities, which are marked by the "two schools under one roof" phenomenon, the most visible symbol of ethnically divided schooling system in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

By creating spaces for dialogue, building trust and promoting acceptance of diversity, NDC Mostar endeavors to be a significant contributor to peace, reconciliation and social cohesion processes among schools and local communities in Bosnia and Herzegovina.



WHAT WE DO

We adopted a 4-year Strategic Plan in 2018 after extensive interviews and consultations with partners, donors and stakeholders (school directors, teachers, government representatives and students). The Strategy builds on our track record and enables us to translate our vision into practice through these objectives:

- Fostering trust and constructive relationships between students, parents, teachers and school officials of different ethnicities through integrated education programmes in primary/ secondary schools
- Enhancing social cohesion through implementing jointly prioritised community projects. NDC Mostar works in partnership with and in accordance with the needs of local communities
- Enabling policy dialogue on integrated education between relevant authorities and educational institutions







INTEGRATED EDUCATION

Our integrated education programme addresses the lack of opportunities for meaningful interaction between pupils of different ethnic backgrounds. It is based on two complementary components: the Nansen Model of Education, and Peace Education, which have been designed according to the specificities of the communities in which we work. We implement our Peace Education programme in communities that are primarily mono-ethnic but have minority groups. These activities rely on innovative teaching methods related to reconciliation and dialogue. They help in combating stereotypes and equipping pupils with the knowledge and skills required to be active citizens. In communities marked by the "two schools under one roof" phenomenon, we are creating opportunities for integrated education through our Nansen Model of Education. This model brings together pupils and students who would not otherwise have the chance to interact and learn with and from one another. They build their critical thinking and communication skills as well as their understanding of ethnic, religious and cultural diversity.

THROUGH THIS PROGRAMME, SCHOOL CHILDREN DEVELOP INTERCULTURAL AND CRITICAL THINKING SKILLS WHILE TEACHERS ARE SUPPORTED IN THEIR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND STRENGTHEN THEIR CONFLICT TRANSFORMATION SKILLS.

All our education activities are implemented jointly with local teachers and become an integral part of the participating schools. Our long-term school partners in Mostar, Stolac and Prozor-Rama report a great appreciation for the pedagogical quality of our programmes and their contribution to a positive school environment.





SOCIAL COHESION

While building trust and tolerance has to start in schools, we know that lasting peace can only be sustained if local communities enjoy social cohesion and work together towards a shared future. This is why our programmes enable students and their families, teachers and other community members to take common action around shared priorities, which often include:

- Refurbishing school infrastructure
- Rehabilitating community spaces
- · Supporting sport and cultural activities started by youth

These activities create an enabling environment for dialogue by ensuring that entire communities experience the benefits that diversity and joint work can bring.

POLICY DIALOGUE

To overcome ongoing divisions and improve below average student results, it is vital to establish open policy dialogue on integrated education between relevant authorities and educational institutions at all levels in Bosnia and Herzegovina. However, repeated unsuccessful reform efforts show that there is no simple solution. We are convinced that overcoming these challenges requires an incremental dialogue process with broad participation of diverse actors (teachers, administrators, officials, parents and communities) and impartial facilitators with accepted credibility and expertise.

We have steadily built our expertise in integrated and peace education and have created strong relationships with educational stakeholders and relevant institutions. Since our work shows that progressive change is possible and meaningful, we will share our experience and results with key actors and decision-makers and bring them together jointly to identify long-term and systemic solutions. Our field experience, strong partnerships, technical expertise and objective approach will inform policy briefs and shape advocacy actions with civil society partners, academia and think-tanks.

HOW WE WORK

Our facilities provide a neutral and open space where different actors can meet face-to face in truthful and honest communication. Our impartial and constructive approach helps us forge long-term partnerships based on trust and expertise with diverse local and international stakeholders.

With key values of long-term commitment, impartiality and integrity, NDC Mostar believes that dialogue is the most suitable approach to empower people who live in conflict situations. As a team, we strive to embody the values of tolerance and diversity and we are proud to put our mediation and education background in service to communities that we are part of.

WHAT WE HAVE ALREADY ACHIEVED

To contribute to peaceful and democratic development, NDC Mostar has already managed to:

- Develop and successfully implement unique curricula for integrated education through weekly extracurricular classes in 10 schools in Herzegovina Neretva Canton
- Coach students, teachers and parents in implementing joint activities in schools and communities
- Successfully implement over 40 projects in the last 3 years involving several thousand primary and secondary students, teachers, school directors and local authorities
- Establish itself as a trusted peacebuilding actor, through establishing strong relationships with local actors. Our constructive and even-handed approach to engaging diverse education stakeholders resulted in formal recognition through a memorandum of cooperation with the Cantonal Ministry of Education

We're planning to continue our long-term programs in Herzegovina and to expand them to Central Bosnia and the entity of Republika Srpska.
